Essentials:


- Metal detector
- Coil Cover
- Digging tool
- Finds Pouch with large area & small pocket
- ½ or silver dollar Coin tube or pill bottle (1/2 full with tp or cotton balls)
- Pinpointer
- Headphones
- Gloves
- Drop cloth
- A way to log your finds (searchable database is best)
- Backpack or duffle bag
- First aid kit with snakebite kit
- Extra batteries



Optional:

- Extra coils (larger and small)
- Dust/rain cover and Screen cover
- Knee pads
- Foldable shovel
- Foldable wood saw (for cutting roots)
- Swingy thingy (helps hold the detector up so less stress on shoulder and arms)
- ▶ GPS, smart phone, or tablet for navigation
- Multi tool (great for tight connectors)
- Head lamp for night hunting

Tips for shopping


- Set a budget and stick to it
- Spending can get out of hand quickly
- Purchase used one and virtually no loss when upgrading
- Only purchase a major brand

Consider factors such as:

- Intended Use (general, coins, jewelry, relics, prospecting, beach)
- Soil type in your area (high mineral or not?)
- Recovery speed
- Depth
- Detector frequency (2k-10k, 10-20k, 20k+)
- Weight
- Signal Type (digital or analog)
